

MVMA VETERINARIAN MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Membership Category	Description
General Veterinarian Member	A person whose name is entered in the register and who holds an annual license to practice veterinary medicine.
Restricted General Veterinarian Member	<p>A person whose name is entered in the register and who holds an annual license to practice veterinary medicine but does not possess a CVMA National Examining Board Certificate of Qualification.</p> <p>He/she engages in the practice of veterinary medicine within the meaning of the Act and MVMA By-law.</p> <p>He/she must practice veterinary medicine under the supervision of a Practising Veterinarian Member.</p>
General Veterinarian Member - Short Term Licensure	<p>A person whose name is entered in the register and who holds a license to practice veterinary medicine for a specified period.</p> <p>The licence is valid for only three (3) calendar months beginning on the first of any of January, April, July, or October.</p> <p>The fee for a short-term license shall be thirty per cent (30%) of the full general practicing membership dues payable by a general veterinarian member in the year in which the short-term license would begin.</p> <p>The person may purchase more than one short-term license in a single year. The person will only pay the legal fund fee once per membership year.</p>
Public Veterinarian Member	A person whose name is entered in the register and who has a license restricted to practice only on behalf of any level of government.
Academic Veterinarian Member	A person whose name is entered in the register and who has a license restricted to an academic appointment.
Educational Veterinarian Member	A person whose name is entered in the register and who receives a license as an appointee in an internship, residency or graduate studies program.

MVMA VETERINARIAN MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Membership Category	Description
<p>Limited License Public Veterinarian Member</p>	<p>A person who does not qualify for a general veterinarian membership with the MVMA. His/her name is entered in the register and has a limited license to practice only on behalf of the Governments of Canada or Manitoba.</p> <p>He/she is a graduate in veterinary medicine of a veterinary university and who has completed postgraduate specialty training with advanced or unique veterinary credentials.</p> <p>The verified credentials must be appropriate for the area of employment that the individual seeks, and the limitations placed on the applicant's scope of practice will reflect this.</p> <p>Generally, these credentials will be a Board Certification, Master's Degree, Doctor of Philosophy Degree from a veterinary university accredited by the AVMA Council on Education ("COE") or other recognized veterinary training acceptable to the Registrar.</p> <p>He/she must provide a letter from their employer annually with his/her membership renewal confirming continued employment with either the Government of Canada or Manitoba.</p> <p>A Limited License Public Member may engage in the practice of veterinary medicine to the extent required by the scope of his/her employment with the Government of Canada or Manitoba.</p> <p>This category of licensee shall not practice veterinary medicine outside the scope and duties of his/her employment with the said government agency or department.</p>
<p>Consulting Veterinarian Member</p>	<p>A person whose name is entered in the register and who receives a license to practice for a period of not more than 7 consecutive days.</p> <p>Veterinary care may be rendered by a consulting member after the consulting member has conducted a personal examination of the animal and has had personal contact with the cooperating licensed member, making the cooperating licensed member cognizant of the diagnosis rendered, advice given, and the treatment regime instituted. The person will only pay the legal fund fee once per membership year.</p>
<p>Associate Veterinarian Member</p>	<p>A person whose name is entered in the register and who does not have a license to practice.</p>
<p>Retired Veterinarian Member</p>	<p>A person who has retired from the profession and whose name is entered in the register and who does not have a license to practice.</p>
