Keynote Speakers



Dianne Finstad used her farm roots to build what's become a four-decade long communications career in television, radio and writing, specializing in agriculture and rodeo coverage, based in Red Deer. After working in both daily television and radio, Dianne is now a communications specialist, pursuing a wide variety of MC-ing, announcing and reporting opportunities. Dianne diversified her hosting skills during the pandemic, serving as an online moderator for a number of virtual events. She has also started her 'TV career 2.0', hosting Frontline Farming Canada, for RFD-TV Canada. Dianne is board director for Westerner Park in Red Deer, and a board member for Lakeland College.



Kim McConnell was the former CEO of AdFarm and led this Canadian-headquartered agency to become one of the largest and most respected agricultural marketing communications firms in North America. Over the years, Kim led many national and international brand and marketing assignments and has been the catalyst behind many major industry ventures including an initiative to build greater public trust in food and farming. Kim is a director on a number of corporate boards throughout North America, and a director on community organizations including Calgary Stampede Foundation, Canadian Agri-Food Policy Institute (CAPI), and the Canadian Centre for Food Integrity.



Christine Baes holds a Canada Research Chair in Livestock Genomics and is Associate Professor in the Department of Animal Biosciences at the University of Guelph. Her research works towards developing sustainable breeding programs that incorporate health, welfare, productivity, and efficiency performance.



Herman Barkema is a professor in epidemiology of infectious diseases at UCV and NSERC Industrial Research Chair in Infectious Diseases of Dairy Cattle, with a joint appointment at the Cumming School of Medicine. Dr. Barkema's research program focuses on prevention and control of diseases in cattle herds, including antimicrobial resistance.



Cynthia Beck is an agriculture mental health advocate and a Masters Candidate in the Clinical Psychology program at the University of Regina. She is researching the effects and usability of an online therapy program tailored to agriculture producers. Cynthia and her family operate a mixed cattle and grain farm near Milestone, SK.



Luc Bergeron graduated from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Montreal in 2001. He has been working in animal health surveillance at the Quebec Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food since 2006. He is currently the coordinator of the Bovine Health Surveillance Network.



Ronaldo Cerri is an Associate Professor in Animal Reproduction at the University of British Columbia and the Director of the UBC Dairy Education and Research Centre. His research aims to discover and develop solutions to fertility issues that affect dairy and beef cattle.



Trevor DeVries is a Professor and Canada Research Chair in the Department of Animal Biosciences at the University of Guelph. His research program is focused on understanding the links between dairy cow behaviour, nutrition, management, and welfare.



Kee Jim received his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M.) in 1983 from the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. He is the global head of animal health and agriculture at Feedlot Health Management Services and is the CEO of G.K. Jim Farms.



Meagan King is an assistant professor in the Department of Animal Science at the University of Manitoba. With over 10 years of research experience, she has mostly studied cow health and welfare in robotic milking herds. Most recently, she surveyed dairy farmer mental health and how it may be related to farm management and cow health.



Stephen LeBlanc is a veterinarian and professor in the department of Population Medicine at the Ontario Veterinary College at the University of Guelph. With graduate students and collaborators, he does field-based research on dairy cow metabolic and reproductive health and management, precision technologies, and antimicrobial stewardship.



Tim McAllister is researcher with Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. His research targets ensuring the sustainability of ruminant livestock production systems. His latest effort is on counteracting the misinformation that surrounds ruminant production systems as the co-host of the "Cows on the Planet" podcast.



Sarah Parsons received her Ph.D. from the University of Guelph, under the supervision of Dr. Trevor DeVries. She now works for Alta Genetics as their Colostrum Technical Specialist where she can combine her experience raising calves and calf knowledge to help improve colostrum and calf management on farms.



Daniel Scothorn is the face of dairy management on LinkedIn and featured as a top contributor to Progressive Dairyman Magazine. Working as a dairy advisor based on the east coast of Canada, he brings global experience, family dairy farm background and a love of science to the Red Deer audience.



Jake Vermeer is a first generation Canadian and farms together with his parents who immigrated to Canada in 1993. He currently sits as an executive on both the Camrose United Conservative Party board and Camrose Reginal Exhibition board. He also sits on the Camrose County Development Committee.



Charlotte Winder received her DVM from the University of Guelph and worked in private practice for 6 years before returning for her DVSc. She is now a clinical veterinarian and epidemiologist at the University of Guelph, where her research focuses on improving the health and performance of dairy cattle.
