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



SHIC CLOSELY OBSERVING ASF OUTBREAK IN GERMANY

Confirmation of African swine fever (ASF) on three farms in eastern Germany, where restriction zones already exist, was widely reported in industry press the week of July 12, 2021. The Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut (FLI) confirmed the diagnoses. The Swine Health Information Center (SHIC) continues to monitor the situation and will have detailed information in the August Global Swine Disease Monitoring Report to be published in the Center's newsletter on August 4, 2021. All three affected farms are near the border with Poland.

Per press reports, the largest farm had 200 pigs and all were culled after the diagnosis. This was an organic farm and sows were able to be outdoors, therefore assumed to be at greater risk of contracting ASF due to the virus's prevalence in wild boar. The second and third locations had two pigs and four pigs respectively.

These are the first cases of ASF in domestic pigs in Germany, however, it has been prevalent in wild board in the nation near neighboring Poland. German agricultural officials have responded to the outbreak with pleas for continued strict biosecurity and diligence.



Biosecurity Concepts

- Biosecurity is:
 - A set of measures taken to avoid the introduction, spread and transport of disease onto, throughout or off of a premise through hazard control.





Sources of Biosecurity Breaks

- Live Pigs
- Semen

- Transport
- Personal and Visitors
- Pest, Pets and Birds
- Fomites
- Water, Food and Bedding
- Manure
- Deadstock and Waste
- Aerosols



How to manage the hazards – Live Pigs/Semen

- Only purchase pigs/semen from reputable sources
- Don't bring pigs into your herd immediately QUARANTINE!
 - This protects your herd/facility from the introduction of pathogens
 - Aides your new pig in adapting to any/all pathogens on your farm.
- Vaccinate animals for diseases




How to Manage the Hazards - People

- Keep track of who visits your place
 - Calendar/sign in book/text messages/delivery slips
- Have farm clothes and boots available
 - No street shoes near the animals
 - No off farm clothes near the animals
- Make sure everyone washes their hands before/after touching the animals



How to Manage the Hazard - Zones





Control the Hazard - Feed

- Feed can be sources of infection
 - PEDv has been found in feed ingredients, ingredients act as mediums for pathogens, salmonella and other diseases can also be transmitted
- Important to buy feed from a trusted retailer.
 - Avoid slopping pigs
- Keep feed in a secure, clean, dry, pest free environment

Control the Hazard – Cleanliness is next to...

- Pathogens thrive in dirty environments
- Keeping the things you can clean, well cleaned is important.
 - Recognize that wood doesn't clean
 - Organic matter inactivates disinfectants
 - The younger your animals are... the cleaner their environment should be



Back to Dr. Dee

- Built a mini trailer
- Filled it with shavings and pigs that had PRRS for 2 hrs
- Testing 4 types of cleaning









T1: Removal of shaving



T2: Removal of shaving, pressure wash, disinfect









T3: Scrape, wash, disinfect, freeze and thaw











T4: Scrape, wash, disinfect, dry











Introduced naïve piglets to the trailer and also did swabs after the scrape out to test for PRRS.







And the winner is?????

T1	Cleaning & removal of bedding	9/10	8/10
T2	Cleaning, washing, disinfecting	6/10	6/10
Т3	Cleaning, washing, disinfecting, freezing, thawing	6/10	5/10
T4	Cleaning, washing, disinfecting, drying	0/10	0/10



Control the Hazard - Manure

- Composting manure is an excellent way of returning nutrients to the soil
 - Needs the right temperature, the right mixing, the right length of time to breakdown both nutrients and pathogens
- Ensure manure is cleaned from pens regularly (at least once a year depending on the size of the pen and the number of animals.



Control the Hazard – Deadstock















The 4 P's to avoid the Apocalypse

- PID
 - If we don't know you exist, we can't plan for you if there is a fire/flood/disease/crisis.
- PigSafe/PigCare/PigTrace
 - Outdoor Access is a certified section of Pork Excellence









PigTrace

- Reporting movements of pigs is the law
 - All pig owners must report movements within 7 days
 - Information required:
 - Origin and destination
 - Date and time of departure/arrival
 - License plate of vehicle or trailer
 - Number of animals
 - Animal Identification number (if needed...not all animals need numbers



Key Relationships for Biosecurity

- Your vet
 - Integral for health information
- Your suppliers
 - Integral for health supplies
- MPC
 - Information about biosecurity strategies, funding opportunities, etc.
- Your friendly neighbourhood swine specialist
 - Information about funding, costs, feed, housing, laws, regulations, unbiasedly offered.
- Your neighbours
 - Working together to keep everyone's farms and animals healthy
- Trusted internet sources
 - 3 am crisis need 3 am answers
